College Credit Plus (CCP)

- Enables students in grade 7-12 to take non-religious, non-remedial college classes and earn both high school and college credit.
- Separate from Advanced Placement (AP) courses:
 - AP courses are rigorous college-level classes taken as normal high school course.
 - College credit depends on students' score from May AP exam and colleges' AP credit policies.

Options and Counseling Session Requirement

CCP class at PHS

CCP classes on college campus/on-line

A counseling session is required of both you and your student in order to participate in the College Credit Plus program. Your attendance at the informational meeting will fulfill the counseling session requirement. Students are required to meet this requirement every year prior to participation in the College Credit Plus Program.

Benefits of College Credit Plus

- Expands rigorous curriculum options.
- Experience college-level work & college life prior to making a decision about college.
- Earn college credit at no cost to you.
- May help reduce college costs and time spent in college after high school graduation.

Potential Risks of College Credit Plus

- Students begin their collegiate record.
- Increased responsibility for learning. Students are sole communicators. FERPA
- Balance schedule between HS & College (budget time)
- Should be both <u>academically</u> and <u>socially</u> self-disciplined. This is especially true for younger students. Students will be attending college classes with students aged 17-25+ years.

Risks & Consequences of CCP (cont.)

- Increased time for travel and study.
- Conflicts in school-year calendar.
 - (Spring Break and start of semesters)
- Students are applying to college and are responsible for communication with the college regarding all aspects from application and scheduling, to attendance and grades.

Risks & Consequences of CCP (cont.)

- Students are expected to return all textbooks and other equipment provided at the end of each academic term.
- Full time CCP students turn in their laptop

Academic Responsibility *New 2018-19

CCP Probation & Dismissal

- "Underperforming" Status
 - College GPA lowers than 2.0
 - WD or receives no credit for two or more courses in the same term
- May only enroll in ONE CCP course during the term to raise GPA
- Underperforming status for 2 consecutive terms; the student is deemed ineligible and is placed on CCP Dismissal status

Appeal Process

- Probation/Dismissal decision
- Make a written appeal to the Superintendent within 5 days of the decision for reconsideration
- Can appeal for Reinstatement after being dismissed for one term
- Policy outlines are provided in the information packet.

Failing or Not Completing a Course

- Failing, dropping or not attending a course intended for HS credit means all costs become responsibility of the student and parents/guardian.
- Failing grades will be included on your HS transcript, and will be calculated into your HS GPA. This may affect athletic eligibility.
- A failing grade will also appear on your college transcript FOREVER.

Financial Obligations

Not covered by CCP: parking, transportation

All <u>financial obligations</u> due to nonattendance, failure, withdrawal or any other types of course change fees <u>must be taken care of before</u> the student's <u>transcripts</u> will be released and before the student will be cleared to <u>graduate</u> and/or participate in the commencement ceremony.

Books & Laptops

Books for BGSU students will have theirs ordered, students will pick up from PHS media center. We may have texts from other colleges (Owens, UT) check with Mrs. Nagy BEFORE going to the college's bookstore.

Full time CCP students are required to return their laptops to the district as outlined in the laptop service agreement.

SCHEDULING (sports requirements)

- Minimum of 5 classes/semester
- NOTE: By OHSAA guidelines, athletes who are full-time CCP must be enrolled in a minimum of 13 semester hours.
- Part-time CCP students, see your counselor or our Athletic Director if you have questions about your athletic eligibility.

CCP is a Multiple-Step Process Refer to Chart in information packet

- Step 1 Attend this meeting
- Step 2 Complete and return the CCP Intent Forms before you leave tonight
- Step 3 Apply to an area college
 Once accepted, take placement tests and/or complete other requirements the college may have
- Step 4 & 5 Meet with College Advisor and schedule your classes at the college
- Step 6 Meet with HS Counselor to adjust HS schedule and to make sure you have enough courses

Parent and student attend the CCP Information meeting

Students who do not attend the CCP Information meeting must schedule a face to face meeting with their school counselor with a parent or guardian.

Step 2:

 Complete and return the CCP Letter of Intent to Participate Form before you leave tonight. Due Date: April 1 (ORC 3365.03)

Step 3:

 Apply to college CCP program & take assessment exam (Ex: Accuplacer)

Must be determined "eligible" for College Credit Plus

Coursework can be taken from any college or university in the State of Ohio.

**Students are fully responsible for all applications, scheduling, attendance, etc.

Step 4 & 5:

- Meet with College Advisor & Register for classes
 - Cannot take developmental/remedial classes (eg. 096 Math).
- Students on 504's or IEP's must meet with the college's Office of Accessibility/Disability
 Services
 - The university must approve any accommodations; without their approval, accommodations will not be given

Step 6: Meet with HS counselor

- Work with PHS counselors to determine how college courses will be evaluated for PHS graduation requirements.
- PHS students must be enrolled in the equivalent of at least <u>five</u> one-credit HS courses per semester.
- Academic core courses at the college will be weighted as an AP grade.

2	2/3 (Sem. Class)
3 – 5	1 (Year class)

- Grades are assigned by the college
- Grades are considered in computing Perrysburg's honor roll, and Grade Point Average.

(Not OHSAA Calculation; House Bill 455)

Courses and Scheduling

- Students permitted to enroll in up to 30 sem. hrs or its equivalent.
- Students are limited to 30/yr or 120 total sem. hours.
- Students may enroll in more than one college/university.
- Pathways are available on the HS website.
- Students must meet with their high school counselor once college courses are scheduled.

Students may begin taking classes in the summer. This begins their fall academic year.


