Visitor Guidelines for Student Orientation

Drop-off/Pick-up Area Information


Whenever it is not possible for a student to take school transportation, parents and guardians <u>must</u> adhere to our traffic patterns in the drop-off/pick-up area to ensure the safety of our students and to keep traffic flowing. Parents and guardians can familiarize themselves with this process by reviewing the attached site map or by visiting the HPI web page to preview how traffic will flow around the building each morning and afternoon.

Morning Guidelines

- DRIVERS SHOULD NEVER BE ON THEIR CELL PHONES!
- Students should be ready to exit their vehicle from the **PASSENGER SIDE** before entering pick-up/drop-off zone.
- YOU DO NOT NEED TO DROP OFF YOUR CHILD IN FRONT OF THE MAIN DOORS. THEY WILL BE "OK" WALKING FROM THE FRONT, MIDDLE OR BACK OF THE DROP-OFFLINE.
- Drivers should always pull forward whenever safely possible to do so.
- Students who arrive after 7:40 am must enter the building through the main office.
- Students are expected to be in their classrooms by 7:45 am.

After School Guidelines

- DRIVERS SHOULD NEVER BE ON THEIR CELL PHONES!
- Students should be ready to enter their vehicle safely and quickly when they are in the pick-up/drop-off zone.
- Students should always enter on the school side of the vehicle.
- Vehicles should always pull forward whenever safely possible to do so.



Drop-off/Pick-up Zone


Students Walking to/from HPI

Hull Prairie and Roachton Roads are zoned 55 mph speed limits. If your child walks to and from HPI, please remind them to use extreme caution when walking along and crossing Hull Prairie or Roachton Road. Also note that there are no crossing guards on Canterbury Boulevard, the crosswalks at the round-a-bout, or the Hawthorne crosswalk.

Other Safety Reminders

- The round-a-bout is **not** a safe area to drop off or pick up a child.
- Do not pick up or drop off your child on Canterbury Boulevard, Roachton Road or Hull Prairie Road. This creates an unsafe environment for everyone.
- For obvious reasons, drivers should never be on their cell phones when entering the drop-off/pick-up area. Not only is this distracted driving practice unsafe for your family, it also puts our students, other families, and our staff in danger.

When arriving early at the end of the school day, please drive into the Canterbury development and then turn around so you are turning right into the school property. This will help keep Canterbury Blvd. clear of traffic in case of an emergency at the end of the day.
