



Municipal Bond Refinancing


In the fall, Perrysburg Schools successfully completed refinancing a portion of its outstanding debt. The total cash flow savings will be \$2,323,000 over the ten-year repayment period. These savings were obtained by taking advantage of lower interest rates. The new interest rate of 1.63% replaces an interest rate of 4.00% on the old debt. The bonds being refinanced were originally issued in 2006 and 2007

The savings of \$2,323,000 will go directly to the school district taxpavers over the ten-vear repayment period. Due to the savings, lower tax collections from the community will be required for the school's debt payments each year.

Guillen Division 1 State Wrestling Champion

On Saturday, March 12, senior Moises Guillen became the 2017 Division 1 OHSAA State Wrestling Champion in the 138 lbs. weight class with a 5-2 decision over Corey Shie of Cincinnati LaSalle. 


Graduation Rate



Cleveland.com recently ranked Ohio school districts on a GPA that they calculated based on the Ohio Department of Education's Ohio School Report Card's six major components: Achievement, Progress, Gap Closing, Graduation Rate, K-3 Literacy and Prepared for Success. Perrysburg Schools' GPA is tied with 6 other school districts at 17th place when ranked with more than 600 school districts throughout the state. Among that group of top-ranked school districts, Perrysburg has the 8th lowest expenditure per pupil.

Respondents reported they most often obtain information about the school district from the *Perrysburg Messenger Journal*, television news, *Toledo Blade*, word-of-mouth from friends, the school district's web site and school newsletters. When asked how they would prefer the district share news and information with them, respondents ranked "newspapers/radio/television media" highest at 48%, "email newsletter" next at 47%, followed by "printed newsletter via US Mail" at 45%, "web site" at 27% and "Social Media" at 26%.
