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An excellent place to live and work, Perrysburg is located in northwestern Ohio. It is a charming community with a small city atmosphere, nestled on the shore of the Maumee River. Perrysburg was featured as one of Ohio Magazine's Best Hometowns and Family Circle Magazine's Best Towns for Families. Perrysburg High School is a four-year public comprehensive high school that offers a challenging college preparatory program. Enrollment is 1497 with approximately 125 students attending our vocational/technical affiliate, Penta Career Center. There are seven 50-minute periods, five days a week, 185 days a year. The graduating class of 2014 totaled 335. Perrysburg High School serves as an ACT Test Center.

ACHIEVEMENTS

- In 2014, Perrysburg High School was recognized as a National Blue Ribbon School by the U.S. Department of Education.
- The Ohio Department of Education rated Perrysburg Schools, "Excellent with Distinction" for 12 years in a row and this year the district was given all A's and B's under ODE's new rigorous State Report Card.
- Perrysburg Schools is ranked 22 out of 548 districts by the Ohio Department of Education regarding our opportunities for, and performance of, students identified as gifted. We are the only Northwest Ohio school district in the top 40.
- Perrysburg High School earned U.S. News & World Report's Silver Medal Award.
- Honored by the College Board on its 3rd Annual AP District Honor Roll for increasing access to Advanced Placement coursework while increasing the percentage of students earning scores of 3 or higher on AP Exams.
- Two dual enrollment, fifteen advanced placement and eleven honors courses are offered.
- 174 upperclassmen took 329 AP exams with 84.8% scoring three and above.
- Sixty-two Perrysburg High School students were inducted into membership in the National Honor Society.
- Class of 2014 was offered over \$11 million in scholarship awards.

2013-2014 ATHLETICS

Our Athletic Department consists of 13 boys and 13 girls interscholastic varsity sports plus club programs. PHS is a member of the eight-team Northern Lakes League and the Ohio High School Athletic Association.

- 106 athletes named all academic athletes
- Thirteen individual state qualifiers, two team state qualifiers
- One individual state champion - Wrestling
- Eleven graduates awarded athletic scholarships

The Curriculum & Faculty

- The Educational Curriculum consists of college prep, pre-vocational and technical preparatory.
- One Spanish course and one World Civilization course are offered as Dual Enrollment courses with Bowling Green State University.
- In 2013-14, 174 upperclassmen took 329 AP exams. AP Courses offered include: American History, Art History, Biology, Calculus AB, Chemistry, English Literature, European History, French, Government, Music Theory, Physics C, Physics 1, Psychology, Spanish, and Statistics.
- Marketing I and Marketing II allow students the opportunity to earn up to 11 college credits through Owens Community College if a grade of "C" or better is achieved in the class. In addition, all course members become involved in DECA, an association of marketing students that prepares emerging leaders and entrepreneurs for future business careers.
- Thirty-one vocational programs are offered by our vocational affiliate, Penta Career Center. Students at Penta benefit from hands-on training in programs grouped under 14 career fields.
