We enjoy having your child eat with us, but charging a lunch is becoming a problem. Your child needs to have \$2.25 to buy a lunch or money can be put on your child's account for them to use as needed. This can be done with cash, check, credit card, or *Pay For It*. Your child is always reminded when their account is low or when they need more money. If money is being sent, please have your child's account number on the envelope or check. The money needs to be given to your child's teacher in the morning.

Please note that all cafeteria charges need to be paid off by **May 26th**. **No charges will be allowed beginning May 26th**. To view your child's account, you may go to the online lunch payment system. This system not only allows parent to pay for lunches online, but also enables them to view their child's account balances and monitor purchases.
