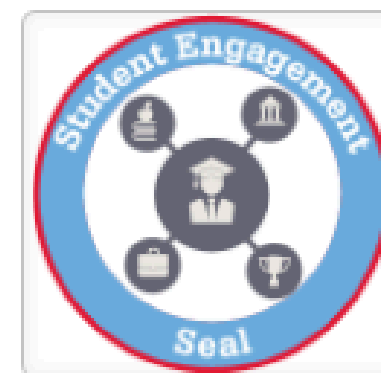


Step 2: Demonstrate Competency

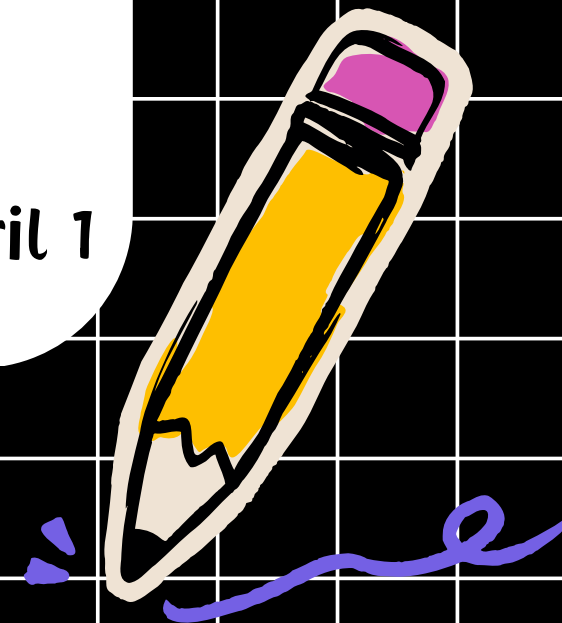
Two Types of CCP:

Please go to the PHS Counseling site to see detailed course descriptions under the "Registration" tab or use the QR code on the back of the course registration sheet your student received in Social Studies class. You will see what core classes you were recommended for as well. If you want to take a honors course, but your teacher did not recommend you for it, please talk with your teacher. You will only need to choose courses to fill the rest of your schedule equally 7 periods a day. Courses that are .5 credits are a semester long so keep that in mind when making your selections.

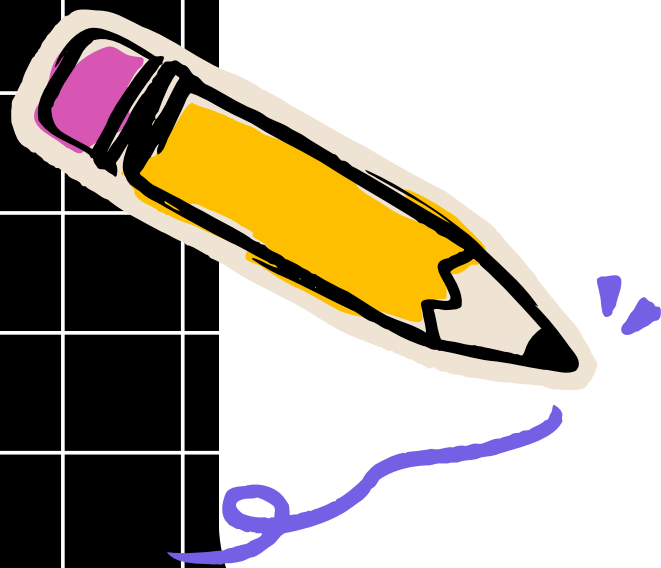


9th Grade Schedule

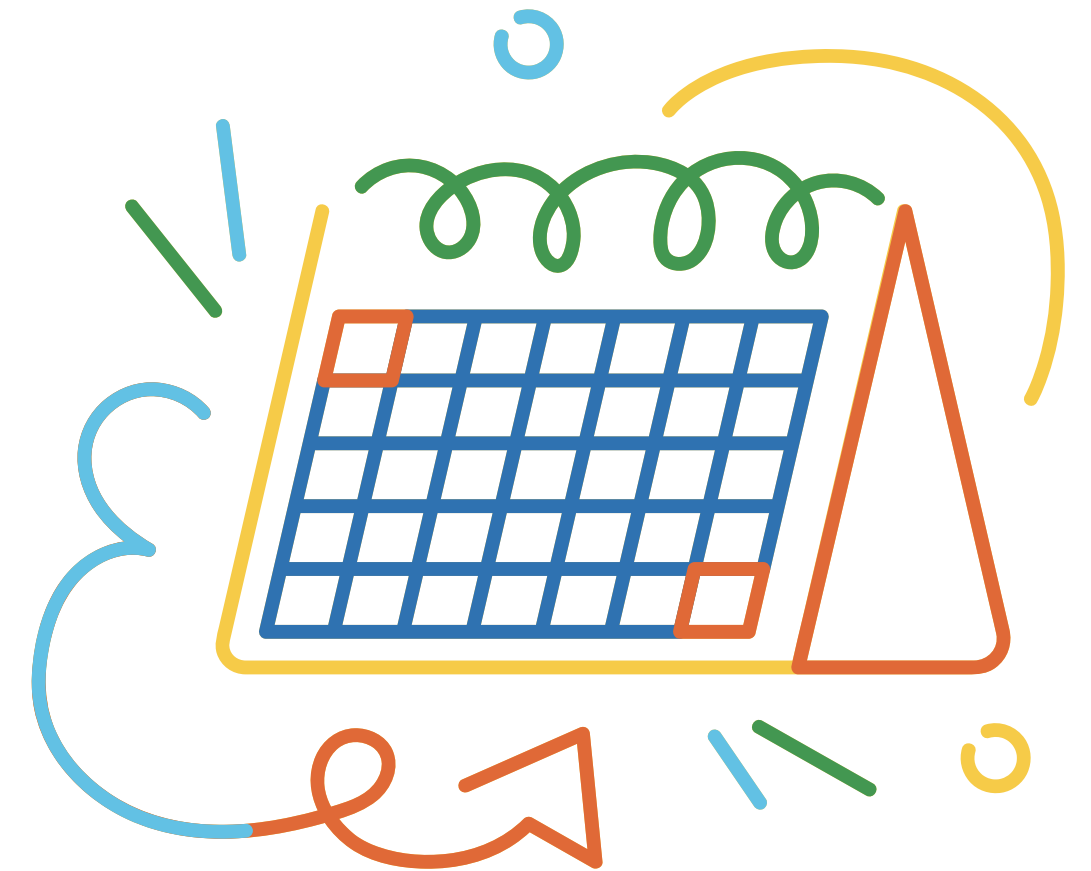
- Registration opened on (2/3) at 5:00PM
