Benefits of 5/6 Configuration

- Balance class sizes
- Enable more focus on needs of each age grouping
- Relieve overcrowding in K-8 grades
- Enhance technology integration K-8
- Improve collaboration and communication
- Enable “loop” option—same teacher for two years
- Simplify acceleration for 5th graders
- Possible to add 5th grade foreign language

Student Safety and Security

- The April 20, 1999 Columbine massacre, changed school design forever
- Various steps will be taken to enhance the control of access to students, staff and buildings

Junior High

- Constructed in 1964
- Serves 1,200 students today
- Electrical upgrades, A/C and renovation in high-use areas

Auxiliary Gymnasium

- Our gym is in use 14 hrs. per day
- Early/Late hours for students can be an educational issue
- When PHS hosts games and contests, the gym’s hours are reduced significantly due to the event
- A new auxiliary gym for Perrysburg will bring our high school in line with all other schools in our athletic league

Why Now?

- Growth in our community will continue
- District will be forced to purchase and install more portables
- Provides safe, secure, and appropriate environments for students, staff and community



Actual Cost to Taxpayers

For the owner of a home valued at:


- \$100,000 = \$3.18 month increase
- \$200,000 = \$6.36 month increase

Funding this Program

- Total program cost - \$38.9 million
- Unprecedented financial window that benefits taxpayers - District is retiring 1.85 mills on 12/31/15
- 2.94 mills (NEW) minus 1.85 mills (RETIRING) = a NET increase of 1.09 mills




Perrysburg Schools

November 4, 2014 Ballot

On November 4, 2014, voters in Perrysburg School District will be asked to consider a bond issue to provide funds for:

- The construction of a new school building for 5th and 6th grade students
- Safety and security enhancements at our elementary buildings
- An auxiliary gym at the High School
- Junior High School upgrades including electrical, hallway and classroom renovations and air conditioning



Since 2001, the district has added 600 students, enough to fill Ft. Meigs Elementary School

Why is this program being considered?

- The district has **added 600 students** since opening its last new school in 2001.
- It has been **13 years** since the district has **constructed a new building** or added on to an existing building.
- The district is currently using **20 portable classrooms**.
- Since 2004, approx. **1,000 apartments** have been **constructed**.
- Annual new single family construction is currently **averaging between 40-50 homes per year** and is trending upwards.



If **growth continues** without relief at the elementary and junior high level, the District will be **forced to purchase and install more portable classrooms**.



How was this program developed?

- Strategic Facilities Committee formed in 2011
- 16 members of committee – 320 hours / 10 months of research & meetings
- Unified recommendation to Board in March 2012 for 5/6 grade configuration
