The Perrysburg Schools Facility Dog Program first began at Perrysburg High School in 2019. Trained facility dogs are now placed with trained handlers in three of our schools - Perrysburg High School, Perrysburg Junior High School and Woodland Elementary School. The Facility Dog Program is made possible through partnerships with Circle Tail and The Ability Center of Greater Toledo's Assistance Dog Program, along with private gifts including the support of Perrysburg Schools Foundation.

Facility Dogs are specially trained to provide physical, social, cognitive and/or emotional assistance to individuals in schools/classrooms as well as in other

the nonprofit organization that trained and placed two of the facility dogs in Perrysburg Schools. All of the dogs placed in the schools have gone through at least a year of specialty training and have the capacity to assist and participate in the school system to help support students.

Information is shared with students and employees about interacting with the dogs and how the dogs support a positive learning environment. Dog-free and dog-friendly zones are set up in each school. The dogs work at school and rest in their host's home each evening.

PERFORMANCE INDICATORS

Perrysburg Schools has earned the **Best Communities for Music Education designation from The NAMM Foundation every year since 2007.**

According to Niche's 2022 Best Schools, **Perrysburg Schools ranks #21 out of 608 school districts for Best School Districts in Ohio**, which is based upon rigorous analysis of data and reviews.




Since 2012, our school district has grown by 19% or 919 students. To put this in perspective, PJHS currently serves approximately 831 students.

73% of funds are spent on classroom instruction, according to the Ohio Department of Education. Perrysburg ranks 7 out of 44 in comparison to other school districts of similar size, according to ODE. A rank of 1 indicates the highest percentage spent on classroom instruction.

Perrysburg Schools, considered a high wealth school district by the state, receives 21% of our funding from the state compared to the state average of 38%.

The **Full Experience Fund** (FEF) was established in 2019 by Perrysburg Schools Foundation with the goal of ensuring all students have a full experience. Thanks to generous donations from the community and school district employees, PSF has supported students more than 189 times since the fund's creation, using over \$19,000 to provide assistance for students whose families are facing financial hardship. FEF aims to level the playing field, so ALL students have access to opportunities across the school district. This includes such things as providing specific school supplies, paying sport and extracurricular fees, yearbooks and money for book fairs - all of the extras that help make the Perrysburg experience. To receive assistance through the Full Experience Fund, a student is nominated by their school counselor or another staff member in their building who is aware of the need.

Facility Community Committee Proposal

A Facility Master Planning Committee, composed of over 50 community members who applied, presented a unified recommended facility plan to the Board of Education in March 2023. The next steps include an analysis of the recommendations by the Board of Education, the Fiscal Office and the Administration. The Board of Education may decide by June 2023 if a ballot issue is desired for Fall 2023.

- Build one new 800 student K-4 elementary school in SW part of school district
- Repurpose Frank Elementary School
- Upgrade and expand Toth, Woodland and Ft. Meigs Elementary Schools
- Expand Hull Prairie Intermediate School by 8 classrooms
- Upgrade and expand Perrysburg Junior High School by 12-14 classrooms
- Upgrade and expand Perrysburg High School by 36-40 classrooms
- Address Fine and Performing Arts and Athletics needs
- Address all deferred maintenance
- Eliminate long-term use of portables
