Andrew Chung, Perrysburg High School Senior, studied Chinese (Mandarin) in Taiwan through a National Security Language Initiative for Youth (NSLI-Y) scholarship. NSLI-Y is a program of the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs (ECA) that promotes the study of Arabic, Chinese (Mandarin), Hindi, Indonesian, Korean, Persian (Tajiki), Russian and Turkish.

Andrew competed with thousands of applicants from high schools across the U.S., and is one of over 400 students to win a scholarship for this summer program. "My biggest takeaway from this experience was certainly the cultural immersion," Andrew Chung shared. "Being in Taiwan was a very different experience than being in the states, and it allowed me to expand my boundaries by improving my language skills and experiencing the daily life of being in the bustling cities of Taiwan. The friends that I made along the way, in addition to my cultural understanding of the differences and similarities between me and Taiwan, was an experience that I will never forget."

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

All eight Perrysburg Schools won Bronze Awards for Positive **Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) implementation.**

Perrysburg High School, Perrysburg Junior High School and Hull Prairie Intermediate School have earned the Ohio Department of Education's Purple **Star designation,** which recognizes the schools' commitment to serving military-connected students and families.



Class of 2022 was offered over \$13.5 million in scholarship awards.

Perrysburg Schools achieved a Performance Index (PI) score of 103.0 on the 2022 State Report Card. This PI score is the 29th best in the State of Ohio out of 605 districts (top 5%). Our schools also performed individually at an elite level, with our high school leading the way. Perrysburg High School's PI score is the 9th best high school in the State of Ohio out of 805 high schools.

Perrysburg High School has again been named


among the Best High Schools by U.S. News. PHS is ranked #46 in Ohio and #1,334 in the national rankings.

In 2021-22, 276 students took 512 AP tests with an overall score average of 3.6 and 83% scoring 3 or above.

80 Perrysburg High School juniors were inducted as members into the National Honor Society in Spring 2022.

Speech & Debate Celebrates 20th National Appearance with 4 Qualifiers



Perrysburg Speech and Debate was recognized at the 92nd National Speech and Debate Tournament held in Louisville, Kentucky in June. Over 8,500 students from 1,194 schools competed in 22 categories, making this the largest tournament in the 97-year history of the National Speech and Debate Association.

Graduated Seniors Bella Aromas, Sydney Rettig and Hana El Nemr along with Senior Andrew Chung were accompanied by Head Coach Debra Kemp and former Head Coach Rick Rettig.

Qualifying and competing for the second time at the National Tournament was Bella Aromas representing Western Ohio in World Schools Debate and Andrew Chung in International Extemporaneous Speaking. Chung and Aromas both advanced to octo-finals during the tournament to place in the top 60. Hana El Nemr competed in Original Oratory with her speech "Sonder," which had previously placed 3rd during the State Tournament. Sydney Rettig competed and performed a dramatic cutting from "Shape of a Girl" by Joan MacLeod.

Perrysburg High School was recognized for their 20th appearance at the national tournament. The team is coached by head coach Debra Kemp, assistant coaches Jennifer Lake and Alex Leong along with parent coaches Melissa Miller and Rick Rettia.
