## Operating Levy

The school district plans to ask voters to renew our current operating levy as a continuing levy on November 8, 2016, keeping it at the same rate it is today. This will not be a new tax. The four-year operational incremental levy expires on December 31, 2016 and generates $\$ 12,925,000$ ( 16 mills) annually, which is $26.8 \%$ of our total annual revenue.

What is at stake? A potential loss of nearly 27\% of our budget, or $\$ 12.9$ million in revenue. This would result in Perrysburg Schools not existing as we know it today. To put it into perspective, we could close Toth and Frank Elementary Schools and displace 1,106 students (\$6,720,000 savings); eliminate all textbooks, supplies and materials (\$2,020,449); eliminate the Transportation Department (\$1,930,633); and we would still need to cut an additional \$2,253,918.
