The State of Ohio has again awarded Perrysburg Preschool a 5-Star Rating for meeting the quality standards established by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services and the Ohio Department of Education. Step Up To Quality is a Five-Star Tiered Quality Rating and Improvement System created to recognize and promote early learning and development programs that meet quality standards over and above health and safety licensing requirements.

Perrysburg Schools Welcomes the Science of Reading

The landscape of elementary reading instruction has undergone a remarkable transformation over the years, as researchers have helped educators and policy makers better understand how children learn to read. In the past, traditional approaches often relied heavily on whole-language instruction, emphasizing memorization and sight words. However, the recognition of the Science of Reading has ushered in a new era, highlighting the importance of explicit instruction in foundational skills (phonics and phonemic awareness), vocabulary, fluency and comprehension. Perrysburg Schools has embarked on a journey to integrate evidence-based strategies that prioritize the development of strong readers.

Ohio Governor Mike DeWine visited Hull Prairie Intermediate School in August to discuss the ReadOhio Initiative, an effort to encourage improved literacy skills at all levels, and to provide an update on the Science of Reading implementation in Ohio schools. The Science of Reading is a body of research from the fields of developmental psychology, educational psychology, cognitive science and cognitive neuroscience

that explains how individuals best learn to read.

"Since our journey began in 2020, our implementation of the *Science of Reading*, has grown from a fourperson steering committee to a team of twelve teacher representatives, a literacy coach and six administrators," explained Nikki Moscinski, Perrysburg Schools' Literacy Lead. "Two cohorts of our educators have been introduced to a course (detailing the *Science of Reading*) and we have had three book studies. We are in the process of creating a three to five-year improvement plan for elementary English Language Arts."

"While much of our initial focus has centered on professional development and phonics instruction, we know that our future will include looking deeper in areas such as knowledge building and vocabulary, writing and integrating text complexity," shared Brent Swartzmiller, Executive Director of Teaching & Learning. "Our journey with the Science of Reading has brought about a deep learning quest that embraces the powerful practices already present in our English Language Arts instructional blocks and is bringing about the addition of powerful programming and practices that will help us continue to improve instruction for our students."

LOWER COST, HIGHER PERFORMANCE

Perrysburg Schools achieved a Performance Index (PI) score of 102.7 (94%) on the 2023 State Report Card, which is the 35th Best in the State of Ohio out of 607 districts - Top 6% in the State!

Perrysburg Schools' Expenditure Per Pupil in FY '22 was \$1,749.82 **BELOW the State Average!**

Perrysburg Schools has earned the **Best Communities for Music Education designation from The NAMM Foundation every year** since 2007.

According to Niche's 2024 Best Schools, Perrysburg Schools ranks #17 out of 605 school districts for Best School Districts in Ohio, which is based upon rigorous analysis of data and reviews.

Hull Prairie Intermediate School and Ft. Meigs Elementary School have earned the Ohio Department of Education's Purple Star designation, which recognizes the schools' commitment to supporting military-connected students and families.

84% of respondents to our annual public opinion survey gave our school district an overall A or B. This is remarkable because 68% of our community members do not have school-aged children!

Perrysburg High School has again been named among the Best High Schools by U.S. News. PHS is ranked #51 in Ohio and #1,442 in the national rankings.

71% of our teachers have at least a Master's Degree.


Bond Issue on November 7 Ballot

A community facility planning committee, composed of over 50 community members, presented a unified recommended facility plan to the Board of Education to address student population growth and facility needs in the school district. The Board of Education voted unanimously to place a 5.95 mill bond issue on the November 7, 2023, ballot for the following:

About those Trailers

The community facilities committee was unanimous in eliminating the use of trailers by 2040. The committee indicated that "safety was a concern" for the students and employees who are using trailers. The school district will need to purchase 40 additional trailers between now and 2040 if facilities are not expanded. In 2040, the facilities committee estimated that 2,700 students will spend a portion of their day in a trailer if facilities are not expanded.

A Savings for Taxpayers

The original ballot language from the November 4, 2014, Hull Prairie Intermediate School bond issue calculated the monthly cost of property taxes for a home valued at \$250,000 with a millage rate of 2.94 mills and would be approximately an increase of \$21.46 per month. In 2022, the monthly cost of property taxes for a home valued at \$250,000 for the 2014 HPl bond issue was a millage rate of 1.5 mills and would be approximately \$10.94 a month. In nine years, the amount of monthly taxes paid on the 2014 bond issue for a \$250,000 home decreased from 2.94 mills or \$21.46 to 1.5 mills or \$10.94 per month.

Hecox Family Establishes Education Fund



The Perrysburg Schools Foundation has announced that the Hecox Family Fund for Education has been created to provide immediate and meaningful aid to Perrysburg Schools graduates who are facing significant hardships that impact their financial ability to continue their schooling.

"I just feel good inside," Bob Hecox shared about the experience of starting this fund. "It's going to the right place for the right reasons. For the average person, it could be a life-changing experience. I was lucky in life. I learned a lot at Perrysburg, it was a

great place to be raised. Education is important. When you get older, you realize that."

The Hecox Family is grateful for their experiences with Perrysburg Schools, dating back to the 1950s when Dorothy Mutcher Hecox began teaching at Elm St./Toth Elementary School from 1951-1978. Her son, Robert "Bob" Hecox graduated in 1962 and her daughter, Susan Hecox Bay, graduated in 1965.

Because of this connection to the schools and generous desire to provide a life-changing college experience for PHS graduates at The University of Toledo, where Dorothy and Bob both earned degrees, funds have been made available for the Perrysburg Schools Foundation to award Hecox Family Scholarships that may include tuition, room and board, books, supplies, travel or other support to help provide for a full experience for students. The gift of more than \$500,000 will generate, through investment income, roughly the amount needed for a full year of tuition, room and board in perpetuity. The fund will be managed by the Perrysburg Schools Foundation and will be awarded to students who have been identified by Perrysburg Schools staff members and the scholarship committee.
