LOWER COST, HIGHER PERFORMANCE

Perrysburg Schools' Expenditure Per Pupil in FY '23 was \$1.001.29 BELOW the State Average.

Perrysburg Schools achieved a Performance Index (PI) score of 102.7 (94%) on the 2023 State Report Card, which is the 35th Best in the State of Ohio out of 607 districts - Top 6% in the State in Student Performance.

71% of our teachers have at least a Master's Degree.

Average Years of **Teaching Experience = 12**

Perrysburg High School has again been named among the Best High Schools by U.S. News. PHS is ranked #26 in Ohio and #698 in the national rankings.

Perrysburg Schools has earned the **Best Communities for Music Education** designation from The NAMM Foundation every year since 2007.

PHS has been named #2,667 in Newsweek's Top 5,000 STEM High Schools.

84% of respondents to our annual public opinion survey gave our school district an overall A or B. This is remarkable because 68% of our

Perrysburg High School, Perrysburg Junior High School, Hull Prairie Intermediate School, Ft. Meigs Elementary School, Toth **Elementary School and Woodland Elementary School have earned** the Ohio Department of Education's Purple Star designation,

which recognizes the schools' commitment to serving military-connected students and families.

Combined, PHS's graduating classes were offered over \$81.3 million in scholarship awards over the last five years, averaging \$16.26 million in scholarship awards per year!

Perrysburg Schools' Average Daily Membership (student headcount) is 5,098.42, which is more than twice the state average of 2,400.84, according to DEW's District Profile or Cupp Report. Perrysburg Schools' Pupil Administrator Ratio is 154.50 students per administrator. The state average is 119.60 students per administrator. Perrysburg Schools is below the state average in how many students we serve per administrator.

HPI Bond Issue Cost to Taxpayers Reduced by 54% In 10 Years

In 10 years, the amount of monthly taxes paid on the 2014 bond issue decreased 54%, from 2.94 mills to 1.35 mills. The project was completed on time and under budget.

Facility Needs

The ballot issues that failed in November 2023 and March 2024 would have addressed student population growth. The needs have not gone away. Despite the failure of these ballot issues, the townships and city continue to approve new developments and multifamily units that will lead to adding more students to the school district. The schools cannot turn students away. The school district cannot stop growth. Planning/zoning is determined by the city and Perrysburg and Middleton townships. Things like "impact fees" or "tax the new residents only" are illegal in Ohio and not an ontion



What Happens now with Facilities?

Following the March 19 ballot issue failure, Perrysburg Schools acknowledges and respects the decision that has been made. Our school district remains resolute in our dedication to providing the highest quality educational opportunities for our students. The school district will purchase additional desks and trailers as this is the only option available. Perrysburg Schools must have seats and classrooms for all students who enroll.

BY THE NUMBERS

Since 2013, our school district has grown by 17% or 862 students.

We have well-maintained facilities, but they are not large enough to keep up with population growth, and older classrooms need to be updated.

The average age of our four elementary schools is 54.25 years, and we take pride in the exceptional care we provide these schools.

Public schools cannot turn students away. We must serve every student who is enrolled whether there is space to do so or not.

It is estimated that 40 additional trailers would be needed by 2040 to address growth if no ballot measures are passed to address K-12 growth.

12 trailers are already in use.

How much money will Perrysburg Schools receive due to the recent valuation increase?

The 2023 reappraisals in Wood County resulted in a 23.4% increase in total valuation for the school district (\$1.1B to \$1.4B). As a result, the voted fixed rate levies will generate \$4,975,022 more in general fund revenue (\$37.3M to \$42.3M), a 6.9% increase, in calendar year 2024. A 6.9% increase will be helpful to maintain current operations with the growth the school district is experiencing, but it is not enough to build or renovate facilities.

Capacity Needs at Elementary Schools

- Ft. Meigs and Woodland are well beyond capacity.
- Need to add restroom capacity at all elementary schools (e.g. Woodland has 9 female stalls, 10 urinals and 3 male stalls inside the school building, which currently serves 600 students).
- Class sizes increasing.
- Elementary encore classes moving to carts.
- Intervention staff (special education) doubling up.
- May need to redistrict neighborhoods for new kindergarten registrants.
- Existing trailers are aging much shorter functional life than classrooms.

Other Needs of the School District

- Increasing the capacity at PHS remains a critical need (36 classrooms).
- PJHS is an aging school (1964) that requires funding to maintain, which impacts operational costs and competes for the same dollars as employees and programs.
- Growth continues to impact the transportation department and its need to service more buses and drivers.
- Stadium needs include enhancing facility safety and restroom capacity.
