Along with funding for the Huskisson Athletic Center, Mercy also sponsors STEM grants, arts programming and a scholarship for a student pursuing a career in the medical field.

A local company, owned by 1994 PHS graduate Kevin Rantanen, generously donated its time and equipment to transport luggage and gear for 6th grade camp this past February. This made for a much more comfortable trip for the students, and it also saved the school district the cost of extra buses.

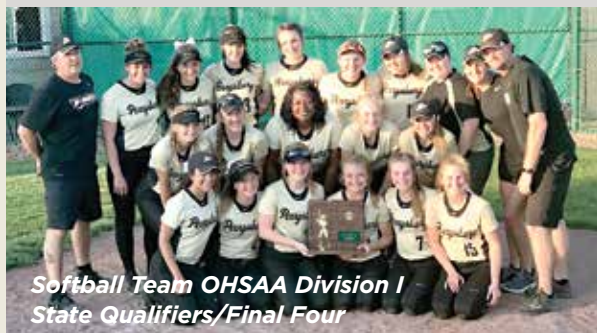

Business Advisory Council

The Board of Education recognizes the importance of students entering the labor market with employable skills and attitudes. A Business Advisory Council has been established, primarily from commercial and industrial organizations operating within the school district and post-secondary partners, to provide recommendations concerning changes in the economy and job market, as well as provide suggestions for further developing relationships among businesses.

Diversity Training & Goal-Setting

Perryrsburg Schools recently merged its Diversity Committee and Diverse Learners Team into one group: CQ CommUNITY. The new team kicked off the school year with a daylong retreat for 21 faculty, staff members, administrators and coaches based upon the data the school district collected through community forums, surveys and focus groups. The retreat included diversity immersion experiences as well as setting goals for the school year.

Hull Prairie Intermediate School & Way Public Library Partnership

Way Library staff and their circulation consortium/vendor collaborated on the development of a protocol for HPI students to request, receive and return Way Library books. 583 student library accounts were opened at the beginning of last school year. Library staff members retrieve and pack books as students make requests. A Perryrsburg Schools courier regularly picks up books and delivers them between Way and HPI. 5,303 items were circulated to HPI students during the 2017-18 school year! ▼

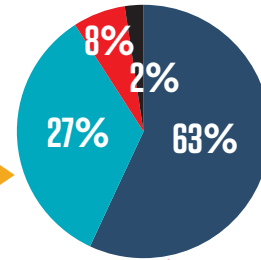

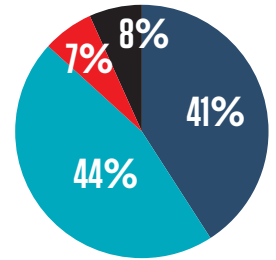

WeCare Program

Perrysburg Schools partnered with the City of Perrysburg and Principle Business Enterprises, Inc. to open Perrysburg Health & Wellness Center for employees and qualifying dependents enrolled in one of the organizations' health insurance plans. It is estimated that Perrysburg Schools will save \$145,795 in healthcare costs in the first year and over \$200,000 per year after that.

Ohio Checkbook

Perrysburg Schools is part of OhioCheckbook.com, which puts state spending information on the Internet. "We place a strong emphasis on transparency and this tool makes it simple for anyone to look up items for a deeper understanding of how our school district operates," shared Pam Harrington, Perrysburg Schools Treasurer.

Examples of Money Savings

In October 2013, ABM Building Solutions and Campbell, Inc. implemented school district-wide, comprehensive infrastructure improvements through its Bundled Energy Solutions program. For the 15-year period after the projects are completed, we have a guaranteed savings of \$330,000 each year, but for the past two years we have saved \$50-100,000 additional each year.

Andrea Glesser, Director of Special Education, is a trained Crisis Prevention Institute (CPI) instructor and provides Nonviolent Crisis Intervention (NCI) training to the school district. Last school year, she provided initial CPI training to 34 employees and refresher CPI training to 41 employees. Our total savings by providing this in-house was \$81,514.50.

We have saved \$2,000 so far by reutilizing College Credit Plus textbooks through a library we have created.

We participate in multiple optional programs offered by the Bureau of Workers' Compensation, resulting in a rebate from BWC last year of \$104,000.

Charter Schools & Perrysburg

When a Perrysburg student attends a charter school, Perrysburg Schools are required by the state to send money to that charter school.

School Finance 101 Classes Offered To Public

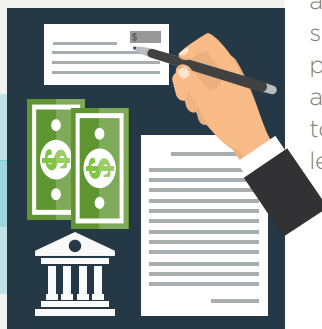
