Q&A Corner

A recent topic submitted to the Parent Safety Task Force included discussion regarding the physical safety features of our newest building, Hull Prairie Intermediate (HPI). Safety was one of the core design features for HPI. Building Safety Features Include:

- Parking Lot Design
- Signage
- Exterior Lighting
- Gated Access Road
- 100+ security cameras (When HPI opened, this more than doubled the number of security cameras in the school district.
- Exterior windows are designed to withstand a Category 5 hurricane.
- Interior windows Several areas of the building have bullet-resistant glass.
- windows Interior the academic wina provide natural light into the center of the building, additional writing surfaces, and a line of site for supervision purposes to the

- collaboration spaces used by students.
- Office Design The office has specific safety features that were replicated in each of the other district schools. Safety features include lockdown features. line-of-sight options, secure vestibules, and an updated PA system. Additionally, each office has a view of both parking lots and main Members of the Perrysburg Police entrances.
- All visitors are directed to the office.
- The academic wing can be locked down independently from the office.
- Inclement Weather- There are several locations in each academic wing/level in addition to the three music rooms, locker rooms, and the gym that can be used in emergency situations.

Perrysburg Division. Township Police, Perrysburg Fire Division, and the Wood County Sheriff meet monthly with school district staff and are important members of our District Safety Committee. The Perrysburg Police held Rescue Task Force training at PHS on October 29th and 30th. included scenario-based "real feel" active shooter response training. Drama students assisted with this training. It was impressive to see the dedication, response and reflection of those on the front line who would be responding in the event of an active shooter.
