ACADEMICS

Our district's academic program provides opportunities for all students to reach their full potential.

Since 2015, Perrysburg Schools' Ohio Department of Education Performance Index Score has increased each year a score was assigned:

- Perrysburg High School was again named among the Best High Schools by U.S. News.
- Perrysburg was graded A+ and ranked #24 in Ohio in Niche's 2021 Suburbs with the Best Public Schools in Ohio, based on state test scores, graduation rates, SAT/ACT scores, teacher quality and student and parent reviews.
- Perrysburg High School and Perrysburg Junior High School have earned the Ohio Department of Education's Purple Star designation, recognizing the schools' commitment to serving militaryconnected students and families.
- PHS named among Newsweek's Top 5,000 STEM High Schools.
- All eight Perrysburg Schools won Bronze Awards for Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) implementation.
- The Class of 2021 was offered \$21.8 Million in scholarship awards.



ARTS

Participation in performing and visual arts inspires students' creativity, problem-solving and critical thinking skills.

- Perrysburg Schools has been honored for 15 consecutive years with the Best Communities for Music Education designation from The NAMM Foundation for its outstanding commitment to music education, offering Band (Marching, Pep & Jazz), Choir, Jazz Singers, Orchestra and Women's Select Choir.
- Perrysburg High School and Junior High School Theatre's plays and musicals are widely regarded as the finest in the region. PHS's Winter One Acts have received numerous superior ratings at the Ohio Theatre Alliance play festival.





STUDENT LEADERSHIP AND ACTIVITIES

- 72% of funds are spent on classroom instruction, according to the Ohio Department of Education.
 Perrysburg ranks 14 out of 44 in comparison to other school districts of similar size, according to ODE. A rank of 1 indicates the highest percent spent on classroom instruction.
- A pay-to-participate program has been in place for extracurricular activities since 2011.
- Over \$5.6 million has been donated to our school district since the establishment of our Development Department in Fall 2013.





PARENT & COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Educational experiences are enhanced by partnerships between the school district and community.

- Perrysburg Schools, the Islamic Center of Greater Toledo and the Perrysburg Heights
 Community Association have partnered to ensure the hunger needs of our students and
 community are met during the school year. The organizations are distributing meals and food
 items on a weekly basis.
- Jackets Giving Back is a student-driven volunteer day in which PHS seniors spend their academic day volunteering throughout Perrysburg and the surrounding community. All PHS seniors have the opportunity this fall to volunteer at one of about 30 participating organizations throughout the area.

A variety of services provide options to ensure all students receive individualized instruction, enrichment and support.

- 72% of our teachers have at least a Master's Degree.

 careers.
- The school district offers a range of rigorous, innovative coursework and extracurricular activities to develop well-rounded, lifelong learners who are also active citizens in their communities.
