- 3. Art Teacher, Ms. Amato, was funded to purchase supplies for her newly developed 7th grade Arts Related Career Exploration unit.

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












WORLD LANGUAGE CLUB

MOCK TRIAL

Hear ye, hear ye. The middle school mock trial case of *State of Texas v. Walker* will soon be in session.


Based on the book, *Holes*, by Louis Sachar, this year's case involves allegations of endangering children and felonious assault. The prosecution charged Warden with these

offenses for exposing Stanley Yelnats and other juveniles to dangerous desert conditions, vicious reptiles and venomous nail polish. But Warden Walker and her advocates will attempt to show that Stanley, the great-great-grandson of a no-good-dirty-rotten-pig stealer, and his new friends cannot be believed. She will urge the judges to conclude that she neither assaulted Stanley nor jeopardized any of the campers' health or safety by requiring them to dig a hole every day while at "camp."

While preparing for the Middle School Mock Trial Showcase, which takes place in the spring at the Thomas J. Moyer Ohio Judicial Center in downtown Columbus, mock trial students will learn and practice the roles of attorneys, witnesses, bailiffs and/or timekeepers. Some will represent the prosecution, while others will advocate on Warden Walker's behalf.

And don't be mistaken, mock trial is not just for students interested in pursuing a career in the law. Rather, mock trial helps students develop the invaluable skills of putting together coherent and persuasive arguments, speaking in public and "thinking on their feet." We are very proud of our PJHS mock trial alumni, several of whom have gone on to participate in mock trial, speech and debate and theatrical productions while at PHS. Beyond high school, our alums have gone into a variety of studies, including communications, computer science, economics, engineering, finance, math, psychology, speech pathology and urban/regional planning.


November 17-19 students took the stage performing *Annie Jr.* Students participated in a variety of roles including cast, student

The PJHS Pep Band will make its PJHS Basketball season debut at the PJHS Girls vs. Arbor Hills home




