celebrated those student achievements and more, including student participants in our music programs who earned OMEA honors, Quiz Bowl, Cheerleaders, Winter Running Club, Pep Band and History Bee competitors, at our Winter Spirit Assembly in February. We also distributed our Jacket Way prize items through the student raffle, which saw students win a mini-refrigerator, JBL Speaker, \$100 Visa Gift Card, a Popcorn Machine and a Meta Virtual Reality System.

We had two fantastic student events with our annual Student Council Lock-In and our HIPP Dodgeball Tournament. The Lock-In saw more than 150 students come back to PJHS in the evening to participate in activities such as basketball, dodgeball, karaoke, yard games, crafts, ping pong and more. Our dodgeball tournament was held after school and featured eight teams made up of students and staff members competing for bragging rights.

In February, our Jacket Way PBIS Team went through their annual Tiered Fidelity Inventory, which measures implementation of a PBIS Program. Our Jacket Way Program excelled with this, securing a 95% implementation score, which saw outside observers come into PJHS to randomly survey students and staff members. With our most recent Jacket Way data analysis, over 76% of our student body has redeemed Jacket Way tickets during the course of this year.

Once again, thank you to all of our families for your support of your student and our staff members here at PJHS. We are certainly very grateful to be a part of such a strong community.

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
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COUNSELOR'S CORNER

MOCK TRIAL

The mock trial team recently traveled to the Wood County Court of Common Pleas, where Judge Matthew Reger gave them a tour of the historic courthouse. The students enjoyed learning about its colorful history and snapped photographs of the beautiful murals and marble stairway. They talked to Judge Reger about their interests in the law, their experiences in mock trial and their understanding of justice and equality. To help prepare the students for the upcoming competition, Judge Reger also spoke about the rules of evidence and their importance in trials and other court proceedings. The students then practiced a few direct and cross-examinations of witnesses in Judge Reger's courtroom, with several of their teammates in the jury box and Judge Osterud on the bench.

Not surprisingly, this outstanding group of students made their coaches proud and enjoyed themselves. Eighth grader Zachary Meyer "found the field trip to be very interesting" because he "learned so much about our county's court system" and because it "was awesome to practice in the courtroom." Another eighth grader, Annie Sawaya, "had a great time going to the county court" and found it "really cool to learn the history of the building." According to Annie, "practicing in



the courtroom was really cool and felt very official" and made her "excited for this year's Mock Trial season to continue." Seventh grader Maesyn Crane "had a great time" and found that the "paintings and architecture were beautiful!" She loved getting "the feel of being in an actual courthouse." And seventh grader Jackson Riha commented that "it was an experience

that will stick with me for all my life." He was very impressed by "the ornate architecture and design, not to mention the magnificent woodwork of the courtroom itself." The students are very grateful to Judge Reger for hosting the event and to PJHS for the early dismissal and bus ride.

POWER OF THE PEN



The 7th grade boys basketball team, coached by Justin Fahncke, finished their season with an overall record of 18-1. The Jackets were the number 2 seed in the NLL Tournament and finished as NLL Champions. The 8th grade boys basketball team, coached by Dave Perez, also played to an 18-1 record, a number 1 seed in the NLL Tournament and completed the boys sweep bringing home the NLL Championship.
