- Thursday, April 25 Science Day 2 (8th Grade Only)



 8th grade Career Expo. The 8th grade will take a field trip to Penta Career Center in the morning to learn about various career options and potential career paths.



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
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JUNIOR HIGH PARENTS ORGANIZATION

YEARBOOK

MOCK TRIAL

The dedicated students participating in mock trial this year have been hard at work preparing for the Middle School Mock Trial Showcase, which will take place on April 19, 2024, in Columbus. Student attorneys are drafting direct-examination questions for their witnesses and cross-examination questions for opposing witnesses. Student witnesses are memorizing their parts and focusing on how their characters can best contribute to the case.

Based on The Giver by Lois Lowry, this year's case involves kidnapping and child-endangering charges against Jonas, a teenager recently chosen to be the next "receiver of memories." The prosecution will attempt to meet its burden of proving that Jonas kidnapped a "newchild" when he exposed him to harm by knowingly removing him from The Community and taking him to Elsewhere and that Jonas recklessly endangered the child's safety by violating a duty of care or protection. Defense attorneys, on the other hand, will attempt to call into doubt the credibility of the prosecution's evidence and will urge the judges to find Jonas not guilty. Jonas will even waive his rights under the Fifth Amendment and testify on his own behalf. With solid evidence on both sides, Jonas's fate remains to be seen.

More important than the ultimate outcome though, the students are learning how to apply laws to established facts, to think on their feet and to work together in presenting coherent and persuasive arguments.

Our students will be meeting on Friday, February 2nd to enjoy a taste of culture with food brought in by some of our amazing and dedicated students. NURSE'S NOTES



The best protection against the flu is getting the flu vaccine.

What is the flu?

Influenza (flu) is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses that infect the nose, throat and sometimes the lungs. It can cause mild to severe illness, and at times can lead to death.

What are flu symptoms?

Flu symptoms are different from a cold. Flu usually comes on suddenly. People who have the flu often have some of all of these symptoms.

- Fever or feeling feverish/chills. It is important to note not everyone has a fever.
- Cough
- Sore throat
- · Runny/stuffy nose
- Muscle or body aches
- Headaches
- Fatique
- Some people may have vomiting and diarrhea

How Does the Flu Spread?

Most experts believe that flu viruses spread mainly by tiny droplets made when people with flu cough, sneeze or talk. These droplets may land in the mouth or nose of people who are nearby. A person might get the flu by touching a surface or objects that has the flu virus on it and then touching their own mouth, nose or eyes (the T-Zone).



Period of Contagiousness

People with the flu virus are most contagious in the first 3-4 days after the illness begins.

Preventing Seasonal Flu

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends getting the flu vaccine every year. The CDC also recommends everyday preventive actions, such as:

- Staying away from people who are sick.
- Staying home from school if you are sick. This will help stop the spread of the illness!
- Cover your cough or sneezes with your sleeve (do not use your hands).
- · Frequently washing your hands will help slow down the spread of germs.
- Do not put your fingers in your eyes, nose or mouth.
